PILOT PROJECT – YEAR 3 COMMUNITY HUNTING 2025 ON THE PARKE TERRITORY

As part of the agreement between the Government of Quebec and the WWFN for the conservation and enhancement of wildlife on the Parke territory, the Grand Council reiterates the call for interest for the pilot project—year 3, relating to the 2025 community hunt.

The project involves harvesting a certain number of moose on Parke territory. The meat harvested will be used to meet game requirements for the 2025 community distribution.

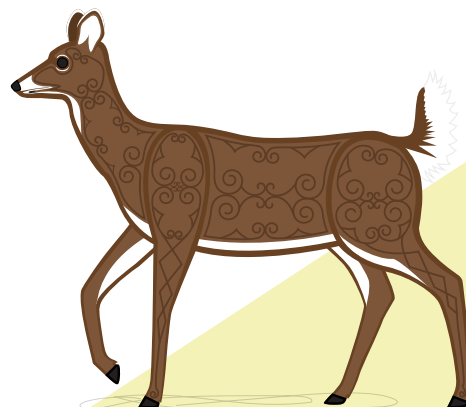
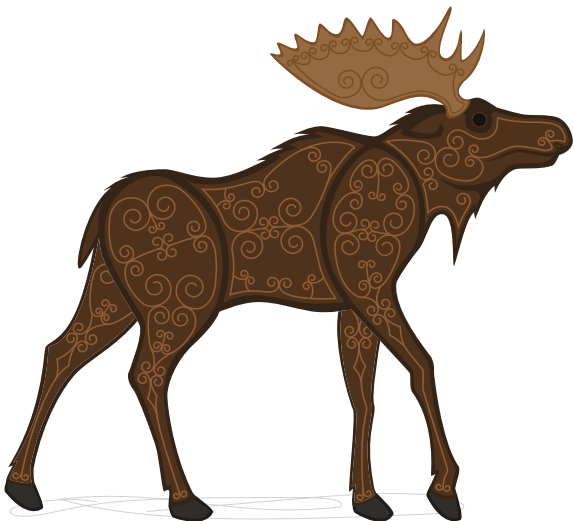
The community hunter agrees to return the entire harvested animal to the Nation, and accepts compensation per animal killed, in accordance with community hunting customs and practices. The community hunter also understands that no costs related to the purchase of food, ammunition, travel, lodging or other expenses will be reimbursed by WWFN.

Selected candidates must hold a community hunting licence issued by WWFN, for the 2025 hunting season. Applicants must sign an undertaking to comply with the applicable rules.

THE DATES ARE OCTOBER 18 TO 26, 2025 INCLUSIVELY

Please note that the hunter's certificate is mandatory for the issuance of a community hunting permit on Parke territory.

Please note that online orders will be processed within 48 hours and are subject to normal postal delivery times.

- 1) Visit the website wolastoqiyikwahsipekuk.ca.
- 2) At the top of the page, click on “**MEMBERS’ AREA**.”
- 3) Enter the requested information to log into the portal.
- 4) Click on “**Modify my profile**.” This will take you to your profile.
- 5) Verify the contact information that appears automatically in the “My profile” inset.
 1. If the information is correct, return to the dashboard.
 2. If incorrect, make the necessary changes in the adjacent table and click on “**Save changes**.” Return to the dashboard.
- 6) Click on “**My permits**.”
- 7) Read the general information for each permit and select the permit(s) desired. Once you have made your choice, click on the “**Submit application**” button.
- 8) Confirm your order by verifying the mailing information. To pay by credit card, enter the required information in the “**Payment method**” table. To complete, click on the “**Place order**” button.
- 9) Once the transaction is completed, the following window will appear: “Order successfully sent.” If you do not see the confirmation window, contact the First Nation at 1-888-399-2393 or at 418-860-2393.
- 10) Immediately after the “Order successfully sent” message appears, you will receive an order confirmation by email.

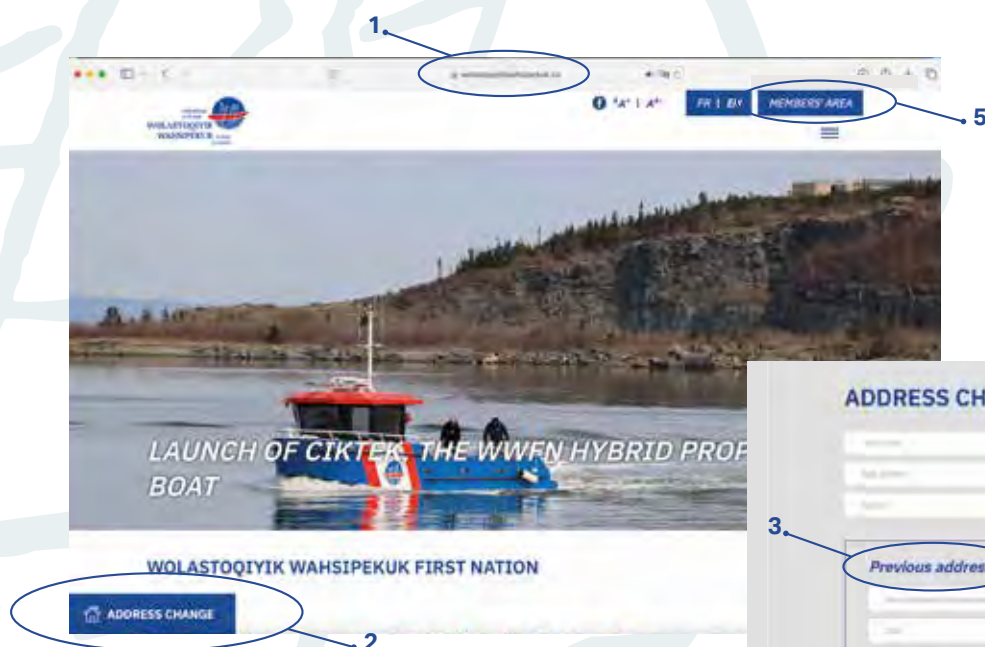

Via the WWFN website:

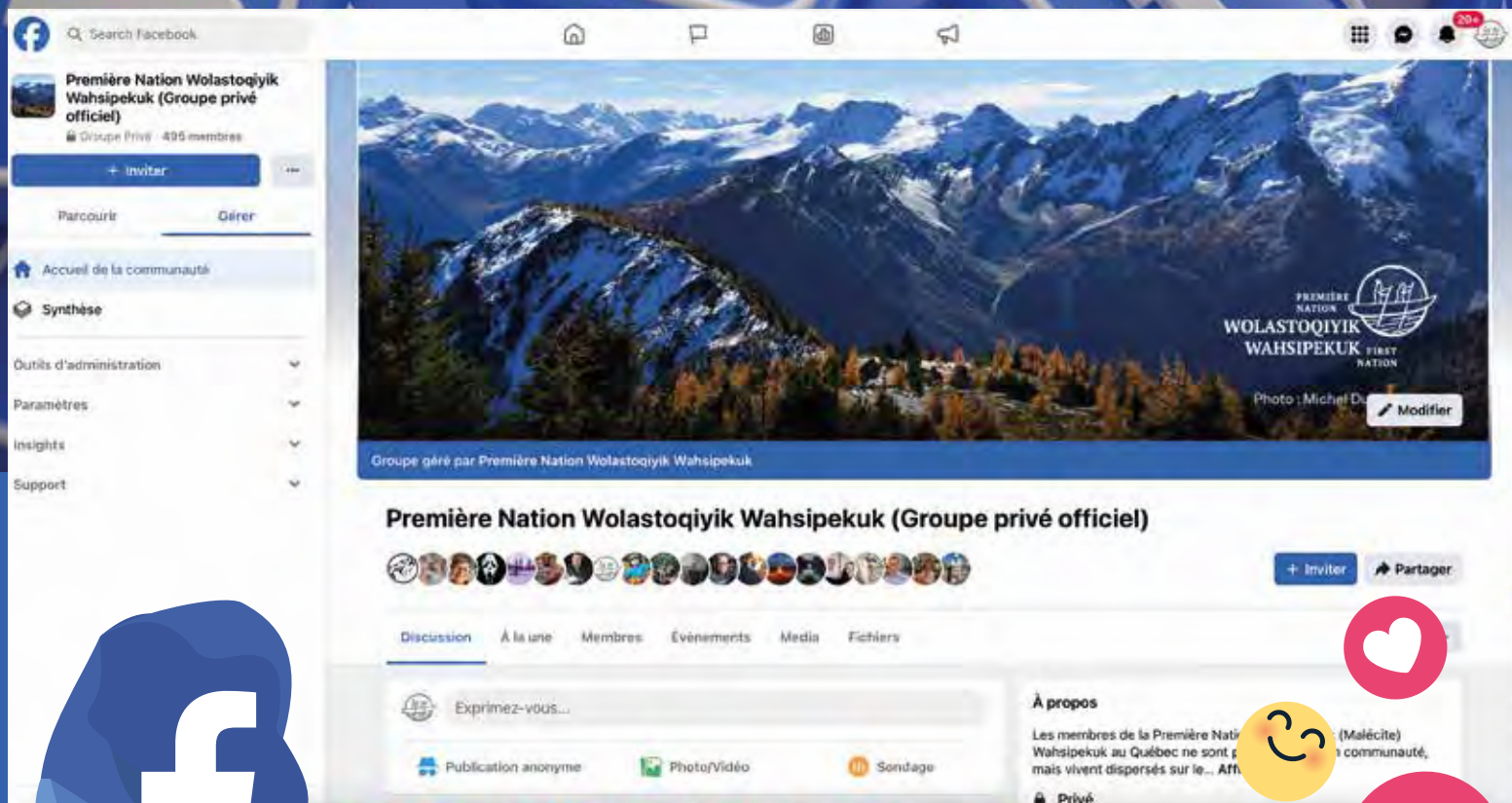

The Pointe-au-Père navigational aid station is one of the most important in Canada. From the top of the lighthouse, the St. Lawrence appears even more grandiose. The river is considered one of the most difficult to navigate, and the best pilots have taken turns on boats operated by companies travelling between America and Europe.

128 steps and 2 ladders to reach the top of the lighthouse. Seaside access.

Recommended visit length

Lighthouse station: 1 hour

Onondaga submarine and Empress of Ireland Museum: 1 hour each. All three tours: 3 hours.

Important themes

History, lighthouse station, navigation and pilots on the St. Lawrence, technology, experimentation and evolution of sound signals, architecture of buildings, infrastructures and the lighthouse.

When to go

June to October

Important

We strongly advise against visits by people with special medical conditions, as well as children under 8 years of age, with or without an adult to accompany them. To reach the top of the lighthouse, visitors must wear closed shoes (due to the unique layout of the stairs and the presence of ladders).
